MONTHLY STATISTICS


Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR)





DARE/Community Policing

December 3rd : Lincoln DARE participated in the Christmas Parade. We had around 15 kids on the float. After the parade, we treated the families to a pulled pork dinner. A few of us mom's, made Christmas cookies for the kids to enjoy. Everyone had a great time.

December 7th - 11th : Officer Christy Fruge spent the week teaching DARE to the 6th grade class at Chester East Lincoln School. LCHS School Resource Officer

Officer Tim Butterfield is our School Resource Officer. Tim's presence at LCHS is a benefit to the students and the Lincoln Police Department. The School Resource Officer is building a positive relationship between Police Officers and the youth of our community, while ensuring the safety of high school students, in addition to reducing crime committed by juveniles and young adults. Tim also provides general counseling, to the students, for dealing with situations that may arise in their daily routine related to law-enforcement issues. He routinely gives speeches on different subjects and participates in classes that may be requested by teachers or students.

Tim responded to 61 incidents at LCHS during December 2015. The most common offenses for December were Harassment/Bullying, Social-Emotional Conflict, Class Misconduct and Assault/Threat.
