New Police Station

The new police station is well on schedule. The police chief has been questioned several times about the progress and the anticipated date of completion. Currently we are hoping to break ground in June of 2017 and the current estimate for completion is in June to August of 2018.

There are some issues in regards to the playground equipment we were hoping to salvage and continue to use. The Americans Disability Act states that any alteration or improvement of the ground components or the playground itself will require the equipment and ground base to be ADA compliant. The cost of these improvements are anticipated to be \$50,000 to \$75,000. These costs were not figured in to the budget. The design has been amended to remove the playground and provide a grassy area for possibly picnic tables or sitting area in the future.

One other question that was brought up was the issue of water runoff. There are no plans to change how the water runs off from the property now and all drainage considerations have been explored by the architects and engineers.

We have great hopes for the new police station and have every intent to be great neighbors in that area of town!

MONTHLY STATISTICS


Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR)




