MONTHLY STATISTICS


Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR)





DIVISION REPORTS

Patrol

While patrolling the streets in March, the officers wrote 6 City Possession of Cannabis/Possession of Drug Paraphernalia Ordinance Violation in addition to the Traffic Citations and other City Ordinance Citations that were written in March.

Criminal Investigations

Monthly Cases Report Summary for March 2017

The detectives of the Criminal Investigation Division of the Lincoln Police Department conducted further investigation on 18 active criminal investigations in the month of March. The types of investigations are listed, but due to the sensitivity of those investigations, specific information is not available for release.

- Six (6) Investigations were narcotics related. These cases involved the possession and distribution of heroin and cocaine, controlled substance trafficking, and the production of methamphetamine.
- Two (2) Investigations involved offenses involving firearms. These cases involved the unlawful use of a weapon.
- Four (4) Investigations involved property crimes. These cases involved theft, forgery, residential burglary and burglary from a motor vehicle.
- Six (6) Investigations involved sexual offenses. These crimes involved both adults and juveniles with offenses including predatory criminal sexual assault, grooming, criminal sexual abuse, and criminal sexual assault.
- The Criminal Investigation Division continued their presence in Logan County's drug court program and assisted other investigators with the multi-jurisdictional narcotics task force with cases they are investigating.

DARE/Community Policing

March 3rd: Officer Shawn Pettit and Sgt. Miles Craig graduated from the 2 week long DARE course.

March 7th: Lincoln DARE donated money to sponsor a runner for the American Cancer Society. All money raised goes towards families in Logan County who have been affected by cancer.

March 20th: Lincoln DARE donated funds to the Lincoln Heat Youth Baseball program. The money helps pay for baseball events and equipment.

DARE officers are scheduled to teach at other schools through the rest of the school year.

LCHS School Resource Officer

Officer Butterfield responded to 117 incidents at LCHS during March 2017. The most common offenses for March were Class Misconduct, Disciplinary Actions where parents are contacted, Social/Emotional, Harassment/Bully and Sexual Conduct.

The school resource officer has updated class safety sheets for every class at LCHS.
